Sports Diplomacy Program

(one-year postgraduate hybrid program) preliminary information

Degree: "Sport Diplomacy Specialist" (1 year, 60 ECTs)

Contact hours: 400 hours (100 in person + 240 online + 60 internship hours + online consultation)

Admission prerequisites: Bachelor's degree in any academic field is required. Preferences go to International Relations, Sports Science, Business Administration and/or Economics, Communication and Marketing, with at least the equivalent of 80 ECTS.

Tuition fee: 1000 euro/ term + 200 euro reg. fee (pilot year tuition fee special offer)

1 scholarship available/ Federations, other employers may contribute 50%

Language requirement: B2 English or its equivalent

Program format: blended (80 % online, 2 weeks/term in person)

The program involves over 40 internationally acclaimed area experts from 3 continents, including founders and practitioners of Sports Diplomacy.

The program is designed to prepare graduates for the broad field of sport diplomacy related studies, by understanding various contexts of sport diplomacy, integrating theoretical knowledge with practical skills, accessing, collaborating, and adopting to diverse national, regional and international application of sport diplomacy and developing skills set to work in public administration, international, intergovernmental and multinational organizations and sport movement.

Completing this program enables the graduates to acquire and develop their diplomatic skills, their understanding of the complexities and correlations in global sport administration and industry, and to communicate successfully in international negotiations, events and other activities. Their capacity to organize diplomatic events, follow protocol, mediate conflicts and promote their nation, sport and organization is to grow substantially. They also expand their coping methods, proactivity, strategic thinking, empathy, integrity and sense of responsibility. Their knowledge of cultural, social and citizenship values will naturally increase. There are important auxiliary competencies the participants may develop, enabling them to improve their coping abilities with challenging situations in the international business and sports arena as well as their labor market value and opportunities. The capacity to handle business, intercultural and political situations, mediate, advocate and represent

effectively is essential for those working on the threshold of sports and international relations, support sport industry, corporate entities, sport events, various national and international organizations.

This program is particularly **designed for those who** work in international relations and sports: second-career professional athletes who take roles at sport federations, GOs and NGOs, diplomats who wish to develop their understanding of global sport affairs, and those who come from other areas of science, industry, culture and public administration with a desire to operate successfully in sport and diplomatic avenues. Since it is a practice-oriented program, those already facing challenges in the above areas will find the program helpful and valuable.

Competencies to consider for credit: professional sport and sport management career, diplomatic career, additional degree (Bachelor or Master) in any related area of Sport Science or Humanities, or other relevant academic fields (e.g. Economics), and further related trainings (e.g. Leadership, Business Coaching, Project Management, Communication).
